

ADMISSIONS POLICY

ADMISSIONS

Admission to Plymouth College is at the discretion of the Headmaster. No child will be debarred from entry to the College on the basis of race, religion or sexual orientation.

Prospective parents should contact the Admissions Department to arrange to meet the Headmaster and tour the School. Parents are encouraged to bring their children with them. If a pupil is registered for the School a form has to be completed and a fee of £75 paid.

At 11+ there are tests in English and Mathematics, as well as an interview with the Headmaster. A report from the Head of the candidate's schools is also usually required. At 13+, entry is either via Common Entrance or by the School's own examination. Again a Head's report is necessary. Scholarships are available in a number of fields and details are available in the relevant documents. At 16+, entry is dependent upon GCSE results and interview, reports and the successful completion of any tests required. A pupil requiring learning support may also have an interview with the Head of the LDD Department and the School may also require a relevant report from a registered Educational Psychologist. Parents must declare any health or learning issues/difficulties (Physical or Mental). Foreign students must be capable of learning in English.

Any complaints about the School's Admissions Policy or Procedures will be handled in line with the School's complaints procedures.

The School keeps a detailed Admissions Register on computer. To comply with Regulatory requirements, a print-out of the Register, in list format and including all pupils in the School, will be made annually. These records will be retained for at least three years after the date of the last entry on the Register in question.
